The recently completed International LLL Convention in Saskatoon concludes the transition to the new governance model authorized at the Omaha Convention two years ago. With the Lord's help and guidance the new LLL/LHM is emerging as a stronger organization considering the diminished activity in Districts, Zones and Clubs. The new model will, for the near term, have biannual International Conventions with Regional Outreach Conferences, as in 2011, in years without an International Convention.

Communications between the membership and LHM, primarily electronic, will be with districts, in states with an active district, who in turn will communicate with their Regions, Zones and Clubs. Another communication channel will be through the reorganized Ambassador program that is currently being implemented in Kansas with Elmer Kellner and Ken McCosh providing leadership. Elmer works in the western and Ken in the eastern regions of Kansas, consider joining the Kansas team to share your love of Christ in your Region, Zone and/or Congregation. We know from Scripture, 1 Corinthians 12 and others, that each of you is gifted to further His kingdom as a member of the "body of Christ" here on earth. As His "Spirit" moves you contact any LLL'er, Elmer or Ken to **"join the team"**.

LHM is addressing a shocking statistic (that of young people post high school to 35 ten percent are dedicated to their faith, though not necessarily Christian, ten percent are anti-Christian, and the remaining eighty percent don't care) with these recent programs: Mission U personal evangelism; Men's Network for young men; and 514 peer ministry to teens. If you have noticed the "greying of your congregation" learn about, promote, and partner with LHM and your local LLL organization to bring to your church these valuable resources.

Praising the Lord by Doing “Whatever It Takes” to bring Our Friends to Jesus

My Dear Friends of the Lutheran Laymen’s League,

“From the rising of the sun to the place where it sets the name of the Lord is to be praised.” (Psalm 113:3) Our “theme verse” for the year reminds us to praise the name of the Lord *everywhere* and *at all times!* We do so in our witness, in our work and in our worship.

In Mark 2: 1–12, we read the wonderful account of Jesus healing the paralytic man; healing him physically by restoring his body and spiritually by forgiving his sins.

As you read this text again, notice how much the “four friends” of the paralyzed man were willing to do to bring their friend to Jesus! They **knew** that Jesus had something their friend needed – though they only knew a part of what Jesus would eventually provide for their friend! Because of their love for their friend; because of his need; because they trusted that Jesus could and would provide for their friend, they were willing to do whatever it took – anything – to bring him to Jesus!

They devised a plan to get to their friend, load him on some sort of a make-shift stretcher (mat), transport him through the dusty city streets and finally to bring him to the place where Jesus was preaching and teaching the precious word of God.

When they eventually arrived, after all they had done, there were SO many people and the crowd was so large that they couldn’t get him directly to Jesus! How disappointing! How discouraging! What a shame! They might have given up; figured that they had done all that they could; blamed each other for this apparent failure!

But they DIDN’T give up! They weren’t ready to “give up” on their friend. They still believed that Jesus had what their friend so desperately needed!

So, they climbed onto the top of the building, made an opening in the roof, dug through it and lowered the man and his mat directly to the feet of Jesus. It wasn’t clean, neat, tidy or easy business, but whatever it took, they were determined to get their friend to Jesus!

Jesus saw their faith and that same faith has been held up as a model for us from the day that it happened until now! Jesus blessed them and He healed the paralytic – both physically and spiritually.

What are you willing to do; what are your congregations willing to do to bring your friends to Jesus? Just **who** are our friends? Jesus was asked something similar one day – “Who is my ‘neighbor’?” (Luke 10: 29ff) Jesus replied that our “neighbor” (friend) is anyone around us who is in need.

Do you or do your congregations have friends and neighbors who need Jesus and what Jesus has to give them (especially the forgiveness of sins)? Of course we do!

What an absolute privilege it is, and what a sense of humble fulfillment comes when we are used as a tool in God’s hand – by means of His word, through the power of His Spirit - to bring our friends directly to Jesus’ feet – no matter what effort it takes us!

God bless you as you “praise the name of the Lord” by **Doing “Whatever It Takes” to bring Your Friends to Jesus!**

The 2011-12 Kansas District LLL Project

The contributions to the 2011-12 Kansas District LLL Project with a goal of \$37,000 was less than \$30,000. The 2nd year in a row with a major drop in contributions from the \$37,000 we were receiving in previous years. The Endowment Fund committee closed out the Endowment Fund and contributed over \$7,000 to 2011-12 project to bring it up to the \$37,000 goal. The first half of the \$26,000 budgeted for financial aid for students studying for full time church work has been distributed. Other budget items include: LHM Seminarian Dinner - \$1,000, LHM Argentina Ministries - \$4,250, LHM Overseas Bible Correspondence Courses – \$4,250, LLL Rose Bowl Parade Float - \$500, LLL/LWML Lutheran Family Retreat - \$500 and Orphan Grain Train - \$500.

Ambassador

Ambassadors, in a congregation, are people to whom Lutheran Hour Ministries can send Gospel outreach items.

What an Ambassador may do:

1. Create awareness for the programs of LHM within the congregation.
2. Ask others to pray for Lutheran Hour Ministries.

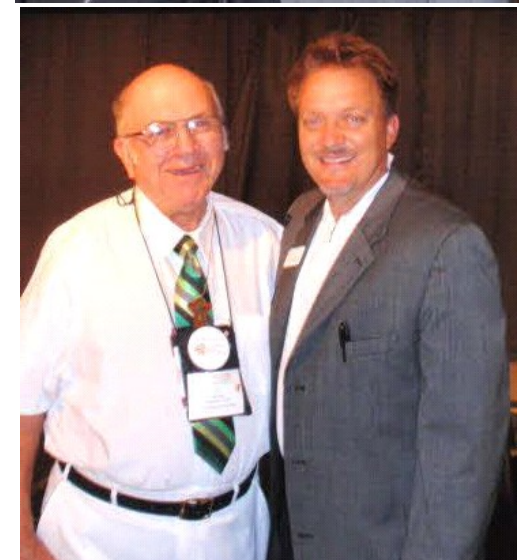
