

## Lutheran Hour Ministries Selects Next Executive Director

St. Louis, MO, August, 7, 2013 — Kurt Buchholz of Glen Arm, Maryland, has accepted a call from the Board of Directors of the International Lutheran Lavmen's League (Int'l LLL) to become the next Executive Director for Lutheran Hour Ministries. Buchholz will join the ministry Aug. 30 and will work alongside current Executive Director Bruce Wurdeman until Wurdeman's



retirement at the end of the calendar year.

"I have worked closely with the Int'l LLL and Lutheran Hour Ministries in my previous positions, and I am excited and honored to be chosen to lead this organization at a time when we are faced with so many outreach challenges and yet provided with so many Spirit-led opportunities to reach an increasingly post-Christian culture," says Buchholz.

"I have seen firsthand how the ministry, under the excellent direction provided by Bruce Wurdeman and his leadership team, serves a unique role as 'Your Partner in His Mission' to boldly proclaim the message of Jesus Christ to a hurting world," he continues. "I have also been blessed to know and work with many of the ministry staff over the years and I can assure you that God has brought together a very gifted group of individuals. It is truly an honor to be in ministry alongside them!"

Buchholz most recently served as the vice president for special initiatives and executive director of the Lutheran Malaria Initiative for Lutheran World Relief in Baltimore, Maryland. In this role he led strategic initiatives targeted at simultaneous growth in three areas: international programs, constituent engagement and internal management systems. The Lutheran Malaria Initiative is a partnership of LWR and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) to mobilize U.S. Lutherans in the global effort to eliminate malaria deaths in Africa by 2015.

From 1993 through 2011, Buchholz served LCMS World Mission in a variety of leadership positions, including interim executive director, where he helped reverse a decade-long trend of decreasing revenue and lead the organization to financial stability. He was instrumental in leading the rollout of a complex \$100 million fundraising campaign for LCMS World Mission that ended in 2011.

Buchholz has lived and worked in Taiwan in various leadership roles, including school start-up and management, and he and his wife Jenny served as missionaries there for seven years. He is a graduate of Concordia University in Irvine, California, in the elementary education program and received his Director of Christian Education certification and a Master of Arts in organizational management from Concordia University in St. Paul, Minnesota.

"We are very pleased that Kurt has accepted the call to be our next executive director, given his past successes in leading large scale initiatives and his strong network of partnerships with leaders throughout The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod," says Wurdeman. "He brings a wealth of experience and passion in national and international missions to this position and we are excited to welcome him to Lutheran Hour Ministries."

## **Kansas District Project 2012-13**

The contributions to the 2012-13 Kansas District LLL Project with a goal of \$33,000 was only about \$30,000. This is a \$7,000 drop from our 2009-10 District Project when we received over \$37,000 in contributions. With about \$3,000 of carryover funds from the closing out the Endowment Fund last year, we are able to fund the \$33,000 goal. The first half of the \$26,000 budgeted for financial aid for students studying for full time church work has been distributed.

The Kansas District Board of Governors at their August meeting proposed to keep the 2013-14 Kansas District LLL Project budget goal at \$33,000. All of the Endowment Funds have been expended. In order to meet the \$33,000 goal we need to encourage more contributions from our fellowship groups, congregations and members. Most of our District Project funds are raised from pancake feeds and soup supper events and special door offerings. The proposed \$33,000 2013-14 Kansas District LLL Project budget to be presented to the Kansas LLL District convention in November will include: Financial Aid for students studying for full time church

work - \$26,000, LHM Seminarian Dinner - \$1,000, LHM Argentina Ministries - \$2,250, LHM Overseas Bible Correspondence Courses - \$2,250, LHM Rose Bowl Parade Float - \$500, and LLL/LWML Lutheran Family Retreat - \$1,000.

The Kansas District LLL made a commitment to fund one MISSION U workshop in each of the five LLL regions, they are still to be accomplished. # The 2013 LLL/LWML Lutheran Family Retreat


