The presenters indicate a sense of immediacy, and excitement existing among the laity about sharing the Gospel and as their gifts manifesting themselves. I know change can be slow but the attitude most common in congregations is "staff" does that. Ephesians 4 tells us the job of "staff" is equipping the saints to do ministry. Dr. Kurt Senske in his book **"The Calling: Live a Life of Significance"** lists eight strategies to achieve a life of significance, the number one strategy is **Make God the Center of Your Life**.

in particular LCMS members and workers, to engage in a lifestyle of living out, and speaking out, the Gospel of Jesus. The conference is a gathering of people that desire to see the Gospel shared in their communities and around the world, and be witness to the Holy Spirit breathing new life into the lost. It's a venue where church workers and laity, who have the desire to see their congregations grow, can come learn, network and worship together. It will create a momentum and a passion amongst attendees for evangelism in their communities and support evangelism efforts around the world.

"The church is in crisis here in the western world," said Alan Hirsch, a renowned **mission** expert who currently serves as the director of FORGE Mission Training Network. "Thinking about the church and witnessing has

changed. The church no longer has the right to address society the way it used to. We face significant cultural barriers to meaningful communication of the Gospel."

Hirsch shared the results of a recent study that asked for people's opinions on God, Jesus, spirituality, and the church. Response was overwhelmingly positive towards God, Jesus, and spirituality, but the church scored very low. "We must change the church because our message is not being delivered," he said. "This leads to the missional church, where our **job** is to represent the ministry of Jesus in the world by constantly adapting to different environments."

"Faith-Sharing Tools" for Those Who are Sent

"Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you as the Father has sent Me, even so I am sending You'" John 20:21.

By God's inspiration, the Apostle Paul wrote, "for when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son." (Romans 5:10) Now, we who have received the forgiveness of Christ are SENT to bring Christ to the Nations and the Nations to the Church! Our loving Lord graciously gives us – who have personally experienced it ourselves – the ministry of reconciliation. What a delight it is for each of us in the Lutheran Laymen League to tell others "that God was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ, not counting [people's] sins against them." (2 Corinthians 5:19) We are SENT therefore to be "Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us"! (2 Corinthians 5: 20)

As His "SENT Ones," it is our desire to be well equipped and prepared to lovingly share the precious Word of God whenever He opens the doors of witness opportunity.

Have you ever thought about using a "faith-sharing tool" to help in your own gospel proclamation? Using a "faith-sharing tool" may help your listener pay attention, focus on, and remember the lifegiving message you share. These "tools" also give hearers an opportunity to use more than one sense with which to "connect" to the gospel message.

One of my favorite faith-sharing tools is a very helpful, bright, multi-colored silicone bracelet which comes with a laminated card for an easy way to share the Gospel. By following the colors around the bracelet and the witness word stamped within each color, you can present God's Word from "sin to salvation and eternal life." Both the bracelet and the card can then be given as a gift to the person with whom the gospel is shared. These wonderful bracelets (in English or Spanish) can be ordered for a minimal price(.99 each) either online at <u>www.ctainc.com</u> or by calling toll-free to 1-888-285-3598.

Another very helpful tool is the pocket cross. This little pocket cross is a reminder of what it means to be a Christian. The cross could then be given to the person who is the recipient of the gospel message. These inexpensive "reminders of the Christian faith" are available online from a variety of companies including Agora. Lutheran Hour Ministries has many outreach tools, many of them free.

Celebrate that God is inviting and SENDING you to share Christ. With whom will you share your faith this week? When? How? With God's help, be expectant! Be creative!

Please, be sure to join along with other "broken and restored ambassadors of reconciliation" in learning how to share the love of God in Christ with those you meet in your "everyday life."

May God grant you the opportunity to share your faith, and in turn, give your hearer a small gift which will help them to remember the faith you've shared!

"Thank You" to each and every one of you for your partnership in winsomely and joyfully sharing Jesus and for lovingly encouraging others to willingly join us as messengers of reconciliation! Go with confidence and JOY because you are SENT!

Shepherd's Canyon Retreat presents....

Dave Anderson and Roger Walck at this year's Family Retreat, Camp Webster, Salina. Dave began to sing full time in Sept. 1974, now having presented over 5,500 concerts around the world. Roger is a skilled vocalist, guitarist and worship team leader. Dave and Roger presented music that is contemporary, with gospel hymns and old-time Sunday School songs with the audience invited to sing along.

Dave tells the story of how he, his wife – Barb, and five others in 1993, survived a plane crash in the Bering Sea. A book and documentary DVD called "The Rescue" are available from Shepherd's Canyon Retreat.

Besides his music, the main focus of Dave's ministry is the Shepherd's Canyon Retreat. Seeing the need for a counseling ministry for the restoration of hurting clergy couples and other professional church workers, after much prayer and planning by lay leaders, counseling professionals and clergy, the first retreat was held March 2009 in rented facilities. Each eight



day retreat has two counselors and a retreat chaplain. All counseling is Bible based, there are twelve therapist that have over 300 hours of combined experience. The retreat board of directors consists of eleven

members with varied professional backgrounds. Dave points out that there is a need for this counseling ministry for the restoration of hurting professional church workers. Twenty percent of pastors are in "crisis", just "hanging on" coping with the issues they face day to day.

In early 2012, the ministry purchased an 8.8 acre property 15 miles west of Wickenburg, Arizona where many volunteers have helped in the development of this property. A new 8 bedroom facility, with meeting space, was occupied June 2014.

He graduated from Morrowville Rural High School in 1960 and from Emporia State University in 1964 with his BSE and in 1968 with his MSE. Kermit was a high school instructor for 32 years, 22 of those years at Hutchinson High School, before retiring in 1996. Kermit also was an employee of the Hutchinson Salt Company and then worked as a mine safety instructor for Hutchinson Community College.

He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Lutheran Laymen's League and lifetime member of NEA and KNEA. He was also a member of Hutchinson Area Retired School Personnel Association. He was on the Mine Safety Team. Kermit loved to read, watch movies and spend time with his family.

He is survived by: his wife, Joyce Elaine (Blocker) Menzies. They were married on May 24, 1964, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Haven. They celebrated 50 years of marriage.

lived in for 84 years. He was baptized into the saving faith of Jesus Christ on May 12, 1929 by Pastor Karl H. Karstensen at Zion Lutheran Church, Linn. He attended Zion Lutheran Grade School in Linn. On April 18, 1943, Elmer was confirmed at Zion Lutheran Church by Rev. W.G. Biel.
