From the Regions

Region 1 Zone 3: Hope—Shawnee It can happen at a family dinner or company meeting; in a coffee shop or coffee-break room, while exercising in a gym or chatting on the phone—suddenly, a casual conversation turns serious, and the person with whom you are talking zaps you with one of those "difficult questions"—the kind that get down to the basics of your Christian faith.

Why do you believe in God? Did God make the world? What makes you think you will go to heaven? Why do you believe the Bible? Why does God allow bad things to happen? These are a sampling of the kind of questions that Sarah Guldalian, a presenter from Lutheran Hour Ministries, made on Jan. 30, 2016, at Hope Lutheran Church, Shawnee, Kan., with a program from Mission U, a personal witness training program, entitled MU-201-Equipping to Share: Tough Questions. Attending were members of Hope, neighboring congregations, and more distant churches in Kansas and Missouri.

Time was spent in learning how to get to the root of these tough questions, as well as how to give sensitive and relevant answers that "bridge" on to the Gospel. Time was provided for those attending to share personal experiences, with a number of moving stories recounted. The emphasis was upon how each of those in attendance could use these tough questions as opportunities for Christian witness.

This program is part of a series of five Mission U programs that seek to help each of us grow in our role as one of God's chosen ambassadors, better able to carry God's message of hope and salvation into a world urgently in need of good news. The emphasis is upon everyday evangelism, reflecting the everyday opportunities for sharing the Good News of the Gospel that God puts in our way.

Mission U can be used by both adults and high school youth. Other congregations in the Kansas District are encouraged to make use of this excellent Lutheran Hour Ministries resource to help their members become better equipped to share their faith in everyday life-- through ordinary conversations at work, with family members, over the back-yard fence, or on a cell phone. May God lead us all to be better equipped to seize the opportunities he gives us daily for passing on the good news of his saving love to others.

I personally hope and pray that my congregation will sponsor more of these Mission U workshops, and will encourage those not in attendance this time to be there for future presentations.

Region 3 Zone 7: St. Paul—Clay Center is excited to be partnering with Lutheran Hour Ministries again this spring to present Mission U 102 on Saturday, April 9 from 9am to 2pm. Our presenter, Pastor Mark Frith, LHM Program Director, Outreach Initiative, will lead us through the Mission U 102 Course. MU-102 — Equip-

ping to Share: Stories and Styles, identifies, examines, and applies seven different evangelistic styles. Students will learn to identify an effective witnessing style as they encounter unique individuals and scenarios. Each student will pinpoint his or her natural style and discover applicable secondary styles in order to develop each.

This course and continuing education is free of charge to all who attend. A lunch will be provided with a free will donation accepted.



Kenneth Ralph Duitsman, 91, died Monday, October 12, 2015 at his home.

Visitation was from 4 to 8 p.m. Wednesday, October 14 at the Ward Funeral Home in Linn. The family received friends from 6 to 8 p.m.

A funeral service was at 10 a.m. Thursday, October 15 at the Zion Lutheran Church, Linn. Pastor David Gruoner officiated. Burial was in Zion Lutheran Cemetery.

Kenneth was born to Eilert and Bertha(Diedrich)

Duitsman at their farm home north of Linn on July 15, 1924. He was baptized on August 3, 1924, making him a child of God for all eternity.

Kenneth attended three years at the Star School and five years at Zion Lutheran Parochial School. He was confirmed in the Christian faith at Zion Lutheran Church on April 3, 1938. He graduated from Linn Rural High School in 1942.

On September 4, 1949, he was united in marriage to Irene Tewes at St. John's Lutheran Church, Palmer. They were blessed with three children, James, Kathleen and Bradley. Kenneth was a man of the soil and farmed his entire lifetime.

He was a member of Zion Lutheran Church and held many offices with the church. He was active in the Lutheran Laymen's League at the state, zone and local level. Kenneth also served on the Kansas District Synodical Board of Directors for nine years. Kenneth was a very active community leader being a township trustee for twenty-six years, a leader in the Washington County Farm Bureau and the County Extension. As a young man, Kenneth pitched semi-pro baseball for several teams, many years, in both Kansas and Nebraska. Ken also loved statistics, as he had kept a daily diary since 1968 of rainfall, temperature and other items of interest from day to day.

Survivors include his wife, Irene of 66 years; three children, James (Joyce) Duitsman, Atchison, Kathy (Russell) Relph, Wichita, Brad (Diane) Duitsman, Washington; ten grandchildren and sixteen great grandchildren.

Norbert Everett Stigge, age 92, died on March 15, 2016 at Homestead Assisted Living Facility in Manhattan. He was born February 11, 1924 to Ed and Ida Hagedorn Stigge. He was born on the family farm his grandfather John Stigge homesteaded in 1869 in Washington County. He was a combat veteran of World War II. He was awarded the Bronze Star.

He practiced optometry in Manhattan Kansas from 1953 until 2007 and was named Kansas Optometrist of
