**Kansas District 71th LLL Convention Minutes
October 8-9, 2010**

St. John Lutheran Church Topeka

The Convention was called to order by President Ivan Grimm.

Ron Bott read Theme Resolution 10:01 based on 2 Timothy 1:7. We have a spirit of Power, of Love, of Self-discipline. We are to use this power to witness.

Opening devotions were by Pastoral Advisor Pastor Seth Meyer. His message was that our God is there with us to support and lift us when we experience difficulty or tragedy.

The minutes from the October 2009 Convention were approved as printed.

Kansas District LWML President brought greetings from their organization. She reported on their convention in Junction City and the various projects they support.

Steve Hanshu, District Treasurer gave a detailed treasurer's report with an ending balance of \$3,707.31. Treasurer's report approved as presented.

Candidates for various offices were presented. John Johnson moves to the President's position; Tim Voelker Vice-President; Region 2 Don Copley; Region 4 Chris Erichsen. These men were elected to their respected positions. Our new Pastoral Advisor is Rev. Scott Snow, Holy Cross, Wichita. At this time we are searching for a District Ambassador Coordinator.

Region 9 Governor Lorris Haarberg reported we are part of God's plan to serve and save others. Six sites are planned for training to help us be prepared to witness. The financial situation is doing quite well. The new Lutheran Hour Speaker will be selected this year 2010. Equipping to Share and Bible correspondence courses are in good demand. The Region 9 meeting will be in St. Joseph, Missouri January 29-30.

Bill Strauss gave an update on the Endowment Fund.

Arlen Schultz led us in a “Spirit Driven” cheer.

John Johnson read Theme Resolution 10:02. Be it resolved that we partner with all Lutherans of the Kansas District to train, educate and support everyone with the news of salvation. Resolution 10:02 adopted.

Marvin Kohlmeier and Andrea Herman showed a video on Mission in Guinea. These people need our prayers to overcome their struggles and also for their blessings.

International Representative Curt Wittbracht gave a report on the various programs of Lutheran Hour Ministries that everybody can use to spread the Gospel. His question to us was “What effort would we make to save a life?” and “Would that effort be more or less to save a spiritual life.”

Jim Bradshaw represented the Kansas District LCMS. He reported on the activities in our District.

John White gave a brief history of the Orphan Grain Train.

Carroll Hackbart presented Resolution District Project 10:03. Financial Aid for students \$26,000; dinner at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis \$600; Overseas Bible correspondence courses \$4,250; Argentina Ministries \$4,250; Lutheran Hour Float-Rose Bowl \$400 and Orphan Grain Train \$1,500. Any funds exceeding \$37,000 will go to Financial Aid. Resolution 10:03 was adopted as presented.

Pastor Meyer closed this session with prayer. This session adjourned for the banquet and fellowship until Sunday at 9:00 a.m.

The Sunday morning session opened with a prayer by Ivan Grimm.

Bervin Mirtsching, Ministry Advancement Officer pointed out how our assets of a kind can benefit Lutheran Hour Ministries. We are to be good stewards of God’s blessings. Our gifts go beyond our lifetime.

Pastor Seth Meyer then installed John Johnson as our new President.

Ivan announced that Elmer Kellner of St. Francis will serve as District Ambassador Coordinator.

Bud Hesterman presented Resolution 10:04 “The Thanks Resolution” thanking the members of Region 1, Curtiss Wittbracht, Lorriss Haarberg, Jim Bradshaw, Betty Kruse, Bervin Mirtsching and Andrea Herman for their presentations, their commitment to service, their encouragement to spread the gift of Salvation to all. This resolution passed with a standing vote of thanks.

Ivan announced the 2011 Convention will be October 8 and 9 in Wichita—site to be announced.

Thanks to Barb Grimm, \$1,003 was raised with the silent auction.

Pastor Meyer led the Bible Study entitled “The Lord loves and saves us in spite of our actions.”

Pastor Meyer then led our closing worship service.

There being no other business President Grimm declared the Convention adjourned.

Orphan Grain Train Kansas Branch

Providing Relief for Human Need Worldwide

The Kansas Branch has been busy the last year. We have had the pleasure of working with Chelsea Mueller from Christ the King Lutheran church in Salinas, Kansas. Chelsea did 6 weeks of missionary work in Kyrgyzstan as a school project to complete her college credits. She came to us and asked if we would help send some items to some orphanages Kyrgyzstan. The Kansas Branch decided to help with items and financing of a container. With the help of Kansas LWML, Kansas LLL, and the Kansas District of LCMS sent 2 containers in the year 2010. These containers were loaded with hospital beds and mattresses, hospital equipment, many quilts made with Love from groups across Kansas, stuffed toys, shoes, 65 bikes that were reconditioned by

the inmates at Norton State Correctional Facility, and lot of good clothing. This spring we helped send a third container to Kyrgyzstan.

This fall the ladies of St. John Herington will have sorted, packed and shipped over 12,951 boxes of clothing for OGT. The LWML ladies of Immanuel Junction City put 8 boxes of hygiene kits, quilts and shoes along with supplies from the Geary County Hospital.

The ladies in the Phillipsburg area have packed over 20,000 lbs of boxed clothing and other humanitarian aid. Another lady in Phillipsburg has made over 250 sleeping bags for the homeless and a lady has made lap robes all out of material that would have been thrown away.

This summer we will do at least 9 fish feeds in Kansas with the money going for shipping.

Additional comments: To ship an apple box size of humanitarian aid averages \$10.00 per box, a 40 ft. shipping container and semi-truck holds around 1,000 boxes.

A report of August 3rd states that OGT has shipped enough Mercy Meals to feed 2.5 million hungry in the U.S. and world.

The Nat's LWML convention had a "Gifts from the Heart" in-gathering that provided these items to OGT; 2,587 quilts, 2,382 towel sets, 2,795 sets of underwear, 5,587 hygiene kits, 13,205 Arch books and childcare's Bibles, 3,875 miscellaneous items – crutches and walkers.

Orphan Grain Train is going to a semi-annual convention, to make each convention even bigger and better, thus no convention in year 2011.
