Greetings from International LLL Chairman of the Board



Dear friends in Christ:

It is my privilege to greet you as the Chairman of your International Lutheran Laymen's League. I want to thank the members of the League for the confidence given to me to lead the Board as it seeks to hold fast to the strong foundations that have been set forth by past leaders and to the vision for a future of Bringing Christ to the Nations—and the Nations to the Church.

All around the world, billions of people started this day in spiritual darkness—in fact, nearly 41 percent of the world's population of seven billion people has never even heard about Jesus. Unfortunately, many of them will end it that way, too. Here at home in the United States, just two in ten people attend church on a typical Sunday. The need is greater than ever for a church that has been SENT with a message of hope for the hopeless—to get moving.

Did you know that ... — 7 out of 10 unchurched people have never been invited to church in their whole lives; — Only 2 percent of church members invite an unchurched person to church, meaning 98 percent of church-goers never extend an invitation in a given year; — 55 percent of those who go to church regularly say they were first invited by someone they knew?

This is why as Christians our response must be to gladly share the Gospel truth with these lost and hurting souls. This year's convention theme is based on John 20:21: "Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.'" Everyone who has been baptized has joined God in His mission to reach the lost with the Gospel. We are all SENT to share the Good News of Jesus with our families, our neighbors, and others in our spheres of influence.

I believe the Int'l LLL is built around this understanding: individually-called Lutherans who come together in a Christ-centered community to bear witness to the Gospel of Christ. In our own communities, we are uniquely positioned to be a movement of rapidly growing, dynamic, multiplying disciples—just like the early church. And when we feel we are not qualified for this task, our ministry – Lutheran Hour Ministries – is there to equip us. Even more, we just have to remember that we have a God bigger than

anything He will call us to do. There is nothing He can't handle ... because the Cross qualifies us.

There is a whole world of unreached people who need to know the love and grace of Jesus Christ, and God is calling us, specifically you, to them. God knows how it will play out and will provide the Light on our path. Thanks for attending this convention and for your dedicated support of the International Lutheran Laymen's League/Lutheran Hour Ministries. May God bless us with a continued call to His mission, a bold vision for the future, and the courage to put our faith into action!

Greetings, brothers and sisters, in the Name of our Lord Jesus!

Greetings from John Johnson, Kansas District LLL President

SENT! July 24-27 was International Convention time in Detroit, under the revised guidelines. The voting is conducted through a mail in ballot or on the internet; so we had reports and workshops dealing with the theme “Sent” John 20-21, business of previous conventions is conducted through balloting and board action.

Lutheran Hour Ministries is placing more emphasis on outreach or evangelism because of societies shift, within our lifetime, away from church centered communities. The eighteen to thirty five age group is the least involved in church of all time. After high school many young people that have dropped out of church must be evangelized as they begin careers, marry, and begin raising their families. Many are secularized to the point they may never return to church, sound like an opportunity.

Convention audio and video presentations are posted to the website at www.lhm.org/conference/default.asp, scroll down to download the presentations. Additionally all the presentations from the 2011 and 2013 ROC's are available as Downloadable Resources at lhm.org/roc/.

One presentation each of you should listen to was by Rev. Dr. Wendt that included three formulas that are commonly held about evangelism/outreach. The first is the community of God's people including me are 100% responsible for outreach. He had arrived at this formula being raised LCMS, educated in parochial schools, Concordia college, seminary and a Doctorate in missions. He concluded he didn't have the gift of evangelism. The second equation, developed after studying Willow Creek material that asserts everyone is an evangelist, is my responsibility is something more than 50% and the Holy Spirit has the rest. This led to many "how to" strategies and mission statements. After prayer, asking God to give him the material for the conference, the third equation developed, the Holy Spirit is 100% responsible through his people, you and I (the church). The primary scripture story was from John chapter four the Samaritan woman at the well whose flesh and blood encounter with Jesus compelled her to share with and bring her neighbors to hear Jesus. What is your formula?

74rd Annual Convention
Kansas District Lutheran Laymen's League
Hays, Kansas
November 2-3, 2013

President John Johnson called the 74th Annual Convention to order at 9:05 a.m.

Pastoral Advisor Scott Snow provided devotions based on Colossians 3:1-8.

Vice-president Tim Voelker offered the ballot of nominees for election.

The ballot was adopted as presented with the following slate:

Ballot was unanimously adopted.

President Johnson explained the electronic version of the convention manual.

Bervin Mirtsching, LHM Advancement Officer, presented information about LHM programs and giving opportunities.

Ken McCosh presented Theme Resolution 13-01 “Son Rise to Sunset.” Theme was moved and adopted by singing the Common Doxology.

Greetings from the KS LCMS were given by Pr. Scott Snow in lieu of President Kohlmeier who was unable to attend. Pr. Snow expressed the district’s appreciation of the mission work of the LLL. Pr. Snow spoke about planting 100 new churches in the district within the next 18 years.

Greetings from the KS LWML were not available due to a conflict with an LWML event being held in Wichita. President Johnson spoke about our positive relationship with LWML, especially with the family retreat.

Pr. Snow installed the officers elected.

A preview of the Mission U witnessing program was presented.

Elmer Kellner, District Ambassador Facilitator, spoke to the two sheets he passed out. The green sheet gave an ambassador job description. The blue sheet provided an outline for a congregational group (ambassador) team.

Ron Bott spoke about the state fair worship. Approximately 230 attended the worship service. The goal for 2014 is to promote the worship service more in our congregations.

Arlen Schultz had the group do a round singing for the 2014 convention in Great Bend and presented historic biblical facts connected to Iraq.

President Johnson encouraged the group to take a convention manual home to someone who would benefit from it.

Nathan Shepman shared a witness experience at a local store in Kingman.

Secretary Hanschu presented the minutes of the 73rd annual convention for approval. Grimm moved and Chretien seconded to approve minutes as printed. Motion passed.

Treasurer Hackbut highlighted the 2012-2013 operating budget and the District Project. Concerns were expressed about lesser contributions to the District Project.

Hackbart moved Resolution 13-02 2013-2014 District Project in the amount of \$33,000 with \$26,000 for Financial Aid, \$1,000 for Seminary

recognition, Overseas Bible correspondence and Argentina ministry, \$4,500, Tournament of Roses Parade Float \$500 and Family Retreat \$1,000. Resolution was seconded and passed.

Grimm moved and McCosh seconded the motion to thank the secretary and treasurer for jobs well done. Motion passed.

Richard Schrum moved Resolution 13-03 Convention Thank Resolution. Resolution was approved by exclaiming “Thank you! Amen!”

Elmer Kellner announced that “Doc” Stigge has just signed up as an ambassador.

Pastor Ken Rorhberg of Messiah-Hays spoke to the group about student outreach efforts being done at the church.

A Lutheran Hour Ministries video was shown in lieu of a representative from St. Louis.

President Johnson

Tim Voekler moved Resolution 13-04 that the Board of Governor’s be allowed to look at opportunities to use the \$30,000 Maike bequest the Kansas LLL and make a final decision. Motion was seconded. Discussion followed on several possibilities. Suggestions included:

- Kansas seminarian scholarship
- Lutheran Hour Sunday and children involvement
- College campus ministry
- State Fair Worship and Booth
- International servant events

Motion passed.

Elmer Kellner moved adoption of Resolution 13-05 Pastoral Welcome Program providing a packet of LHM information to new pastors in the district and increase the budget by \$1000 to cover the expenses. It was suggested the desk name plate be included. President Johnson suggested to increase the budget \$1000 to fund the program. Motion second by Merle Lietz. Motion passed.

President Johnson presented Voelker, Hackbart, Hanschu, McCosh, Schultz, Bott, Kellner, Schrum with a LHM lapel pin in appreciation of past service.

President Johnson presented Gary Neuschafer with a box of golf balls in appreciation of being chairman of the Golf Committee.

President Johnson auctioned used golf balls to raise funds for the district project.

Arlen Schultz, Region 5 Rep, announced the 2014 convention will be held in Great Bend, Saturday and Sunday November 1-2 at the Best Western hotel. Theme will focus on celebrating 75th anniversary of the Kansas LLL.

President Johnson recognized past presidents Lietz, Strauss, Walters, Grimm, Hanschu.

Merle Lietz announced Edna Weigle, wife of former president Paul Weigle, passed away.

A drawing was held for LHM canvas bags and a PC Junior.

Couples celebrating 50 years or more of marriage were recognized.

Joe Chretien announced that the entertainment person for the evening sustained an eye injury today and would not be able to perform following the banquet this evening.

Elmer Kellner closed the convention with prayer.

President Johnson declared the 74th annual convention adjourned at 3:45 p.m.
